Excerpts from the Pastor's Column by Rev. Ed Inabinet:

"The Christmas season is noted for its music. You


will hear music almost anywhere you go between Thanksgiving and Christmas Day . . . Most people come to the place of taking the words in music for granted. They lack any current meaning if ever they had meaning to begin with in people's lives. The same kind of things can happen to Christians. The treadmill of familiarity and trying to meet unrealistic expectations while going through the forms of celebration take the fire, the joy, the wonder away from us. We know the words of the story, but we lose the music of the heart. What can we do to make sure that we not only know the words of the story but also have the true music of Christmas ringing in our hearts? We can read the story in a different translation in the Bible. We can listen to a great musical composition like the Messiah or to some contemporary Christmas cantatas. We can renew our commitment to making the spirit of Christmas a reality for others. The spirit is found in the words, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son." As we make conscious effort to give of ourselves, to love, encourage, help, and bless the lives of other people, the true music will return. . . . One thing is for certain, Christmas is not outward activity so much as it is inward communion with the Savior . . . As with settled determination, we say to Him, "O come to my heart, Lord Jesus, there is room in my heart for thee," we will find that the words take on new meaning and we'll have the music singing within us.
