Indeed, as I looked, the sinews and the flesh came upon them, and the skin covered them over; but there was no breath in them." (Ezekiel 37:7-8) Ezekiel continues, "So I prophesied as He commanded me, and breath came into them, and they lived, and stood upon their feet, an exceedingly great army." (Ezekiel 37:10) Can you imagine seeing a bunch of bones rattling as they came together to become a great army? Not only that but there will be a day when all the bodies of the deceased "soldiers" of Christ will come back to life. At Christ's return the Bible says, "For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first."
